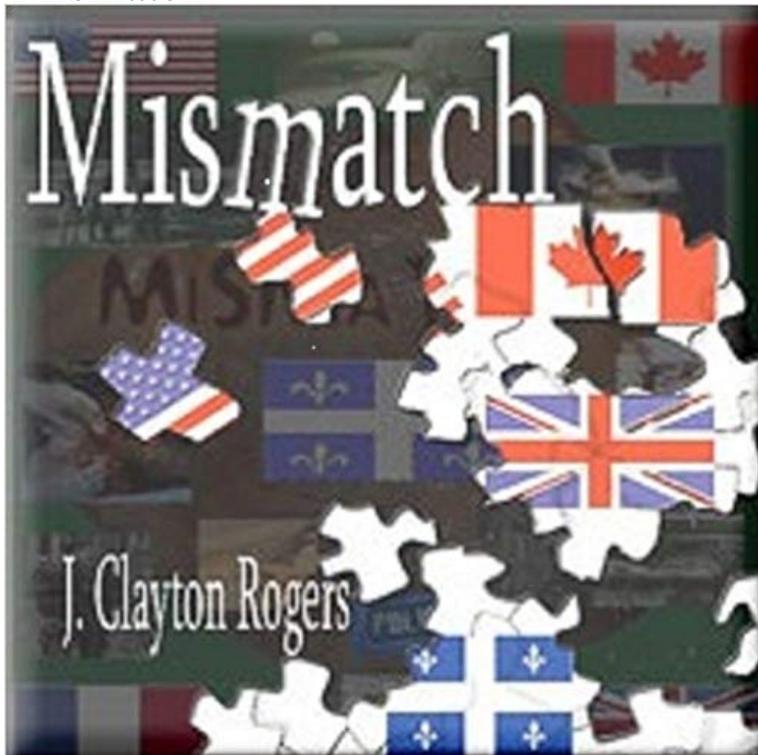


Mismatch
