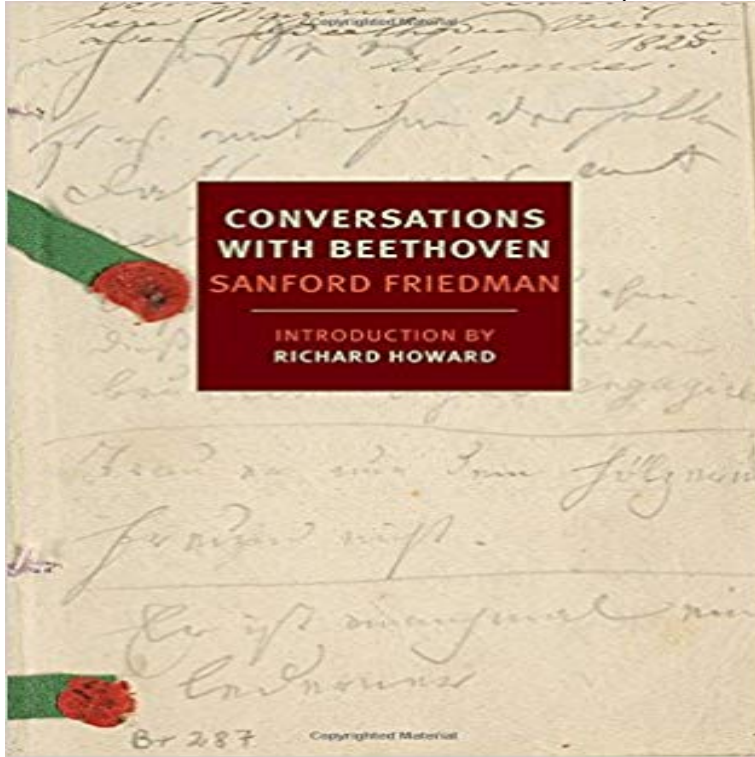


## Conversations with Beethoven (NYRB Classics)
