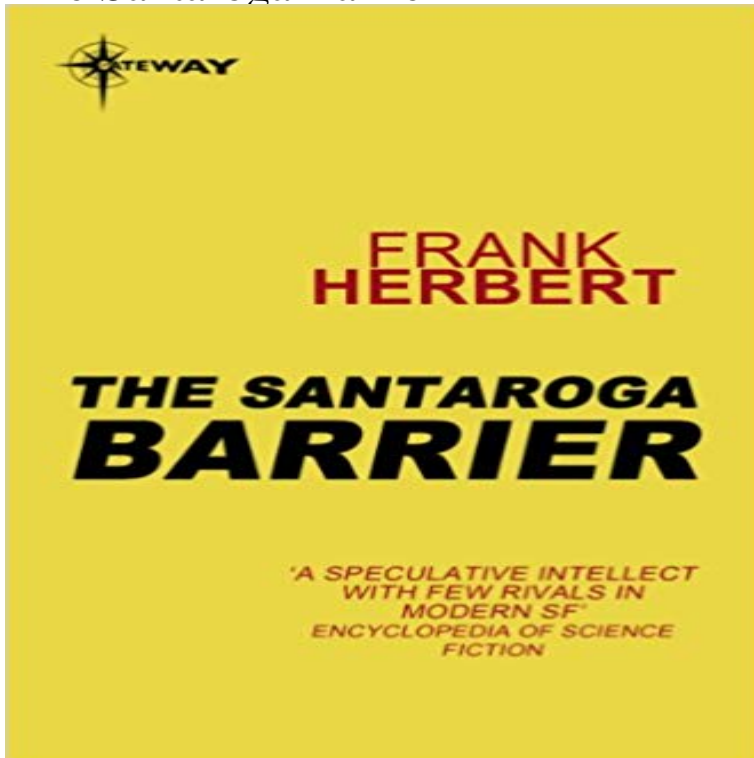


The Santaroga Barrier
