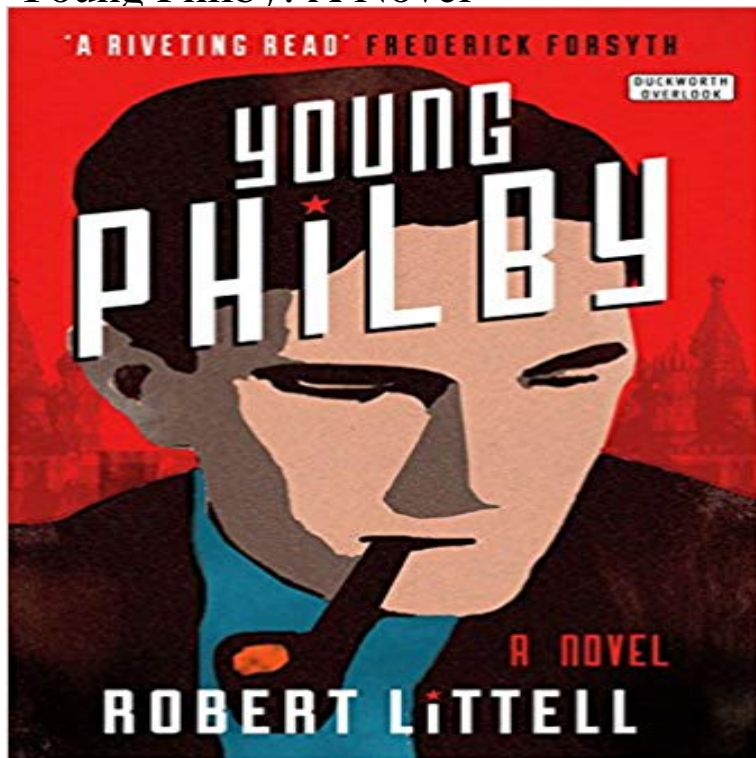


Young Philby: A Novel
